# Hearing under the *Motor Dealer Act*Decision re: David MacRae

1	Surrey, B.C.
2	April 4, 2013
3	REGISTRAR: I will give an oral decision here. First
4	off, as a preliminary matter, I note that Mr.
5	MacRae was served by registered mail. It was
6	mailed out and accepted by Canada Post on March
7	5th of this year in accordance with s. 30(1) of
8	the Motor Dealer Act. In accordance with s.
9	30(2) of that Act, service is deemed to have been
10	made on the third day, being March 8th of this
11	year.
12	Mr. MacRae is not in attendance. I also have
13	the evidence from Ms. Murphy that she spoke to
14	him about this hearing, and he did not indicate
15	he would be here or would attend or participate
16	in any way.
17	Under s. 7(e) of the Salesperson Licensing
18	Regulation, I may continue with the hearing in
19	the absence of a licensee, and I have chosen to
20	do so.
21	Based on the evidence that there is an
22	outstanding warrant for the arrest of Mr. MacRae
23	in Alberta, the fact that Mr. MacRae has chosen
24	not to abide by the lawful order of the Registrar
25	to appear at this hearing to review his licence,

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I am concerned that Mr. MacRae's continued licence as a salesperson is not in the public interest. It is a concern because it shows a disregard for following legal processes, for abiding by legal processes, and to answer to lawful orders regarding Mr. MacRae's conduct.

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I note that Mr. MacRae was given a decision — or was attempted to be given a decision of the Registrar as dated November 10th, 2010, Arash Taheri. In that decision I noted that it is important for any person to be licensed so show a willingness and requirement to deal with any legal processes they are engaged in, especially criminal matters, so that we, the public, can know that they will abide by the law and so that we can properly assess whether Mr. MacRae, in this case, has been guilty of the charges laid.

In this particular case I find that Mr.

MacRae is avoiding service, is avoiding legal

processes, both in the Alberta courts and before

the Registrar, and that it is not in the public

interest that he be continued to be licensed as a

salesperson. I, therefore, order his salesperson

licence cancelled effective immediately.

Is there anything further, Mr. Wong?
