across all departments. Also included in the report are vehicle sales statistics showing B.C. sales by dealer type. Continued strong sales created a busy year for the industry and the VSA. Licensed salespeople and dealers both increased over the previous year, a trend that has not stopped as of this Bulletin. Active salesperson licences grew from 7,950 to 8,200 by yearend, and are now at just under 8,300. Dealer licences grew at nearly the same 3% rate, reaching 1,500 in April. In addition, the new fiscal year has seen 50 licence applications from Wholesalers.
