The Vehicle Sales Authority gained new powers to reduce unlicensed selling, including curbing, on January 1, 2018. The VSA has begun to exercise this authority as resources permit. While recent activity has been limited to communities in the Lower Mainland, case files are underway in communities around the province.

As with action taken against licensed dealers and salespeople, any penalties must be appropriate to the documented unlicensed activity and follow the principles of natural justice and administrative fairness. This includes the licensing conditions placed on an individual who was curbing vehicles while licensed.

What is a compliance order?

A compliance order is an administrative order issued by the registrar to correct non-compliant conduct or fix harm caused by that conduct. For example, a compliance order may impose conditions or prohibits on a licensee or order a licensee to pay compensation. If a compliance order is filed in court, it then becomes a court order.
